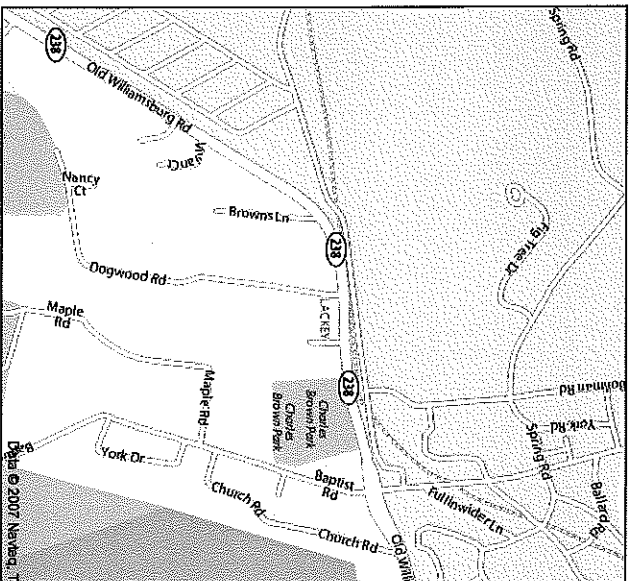

A Decade of Good Works

In 1995, Dr. Jim Shaw and his wife, Cooka Shaw, decided to answer a persistent call from God to serve Him by providing free health care for the uninsured. They partnered with Rising Sun Baptist Church to provide a free clinic one night a week. There, a handful of volunteers began treating the medically disadvantaged in the Lackey community.

Word of the clinic spread slowly at first. However, the Shaws persisted in their efforts. After York County allowed the Clinic to operate out of the Charles Brown Community Center, the stream of patients and volunteers grew and so did the vision.

In 2003, after much prayer, hard work and the generous support from the community, Lackey Free Clinic opened the doors of a new building down the street from the community center.

In the ensuing years, the clinic added The Pharmacy Connection enabling the patients to access free medicine. A free dental clinic and the first chronic care clinic were also added. In 2009 there were over 7,600 visits.

Eligibility Requirements

Patients must live within our service area, have no medical insurance and meet income guidelines of 200% or below the federal poverty level.

Areas served include York County, Newport News, Williamsburg, James City County and Poquoson. Patients may call to schedule an intake screening appointment at 757-886-0608.

The Lackey Free Clinic is administered under Olivet Medical Ministry Inc. which is governed by an elected Board of Directors and is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit corporation. The ministry receives financial support from the Peninsula community including hospitals, foundations and individual donors.

The Need for Lackey

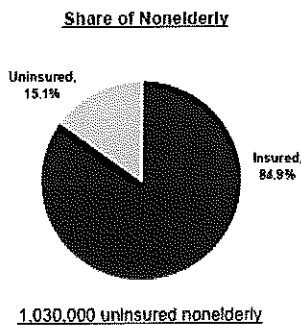
In 2009, the minimum wage for a full-time job paid **\$14,268** per year. The average health insurance premium for a family was **\$13,375**.

Risks to the Uninsured

As many as 10 working Virginians die each week due to lack of health care. From 2000-2006 an estimated 3,200 uninsured Virginians died.

Lackey by Numbers (in of 2009)

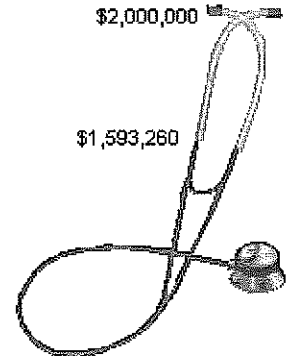

New Initiatives in 2010

Mental Health Clinic: Individual & group counseling for those with anxiety or depression.
Understanding Control Through Activity and Navigation (UCAN): Diabetic counseling using clinical management and physical fitness taking into consideration the socioeconomic status component of our patient base.

Wound Care Clinic: Services patients with various skin care issues including diabetic ulcers, biopsies, injuries and specialized skin care conditions

Healthy Woman Initiative: In partnership with Riverside and Every Woman's Life, a clinic will be held twice a year targeting woman between 35-64 years old screening for breast, cervical, colon and skin cancer.
